The second of this year's car tours for Friends and guests will take place on the afternoon of Sunday 10 July commencing at Ribbesford at 2.30. We will visit three churches concluding with tea at Astley. Our Chairman and author of "Churches of Worcestershire", Tim Bridges will give a short talk on the history of each of the churches.

The cost is £8 per attendee to include tea. Cheques payable to WDHCT.

Ribbesford St Leonard – Norman in origin, enlarged in the C15, with restoration work by Frederick Preedy after the church was struck by lightning in 1877. Parking adjacent to the church (DY12 2TQ)

Areley Kings St Bartholomew – A red sandstone church on an elevated site dating from the 14th and 15th Centuries with restoration work by Preedy in 1876. Norman font and Church House (Ale House) built in 1536. It is hoped that Church House will be opened for our visit. Parking adjacent to the church (DY13 0AR)

Astley St Peter – A Benedictine foundation, the present building dates from the middle of the 12th century. Parking adjacent to the Church. We will enjoy tea here. (DY13 0RJ)
